Daughter of Wayne S. and Anabel Stevens Grow, she lived in Frazer all her life. She was a 1965 graduate of Great Valley Senior High School.

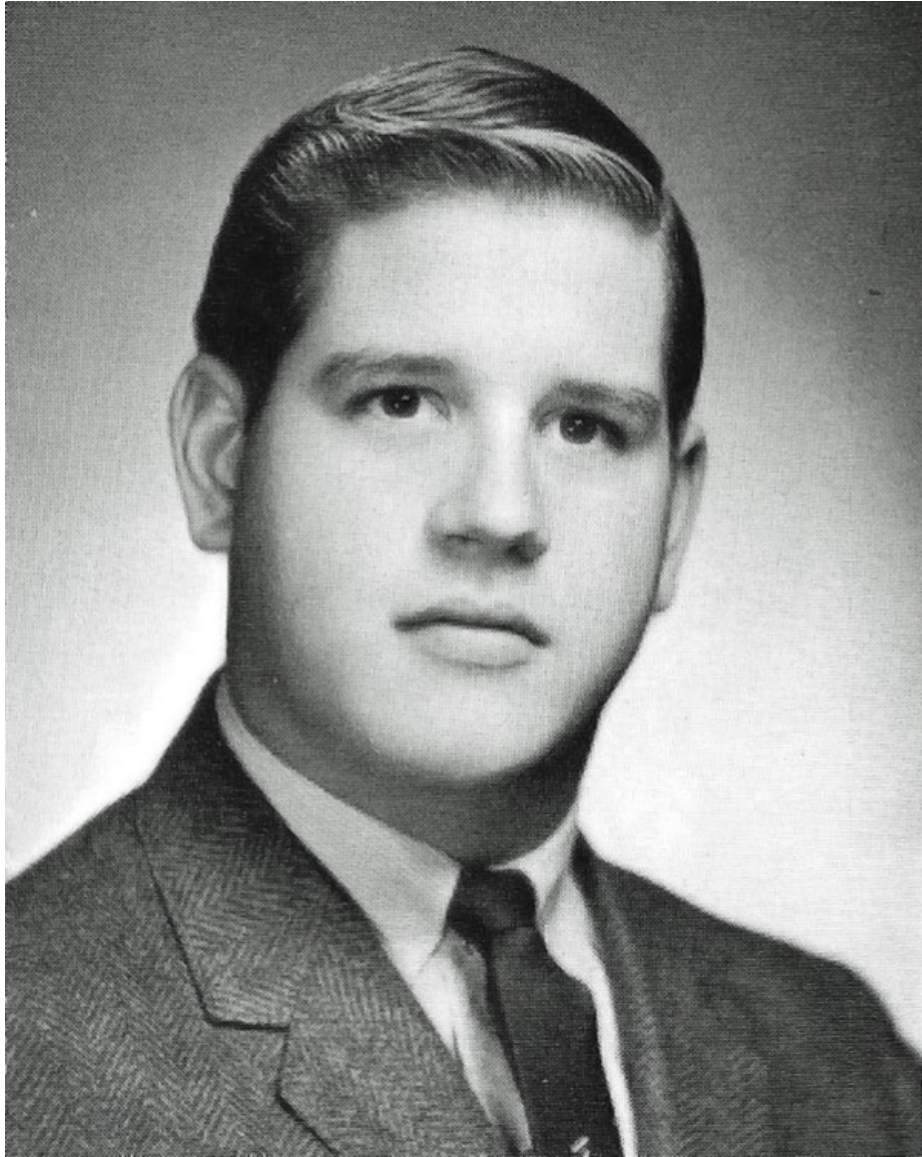
Mrs. Nixon was a financial secretary at Paoli Memorial Hospital.

## McLaughlin, William L. Lawyer and Life-Long Sailor

William Leo McLaughlin, Jr. died suddenly Saturday, March 26, 2016 in West Palm Beach, Florida while on vacation pursuing one of his lifelong passions, sailboat racing. He was 69.

The only child of the late William Leo and Nellie Vidunis McLaughlin, Bill was born in Pittsburgh in 1947. In the 1950's, the family moved to Paoli where his father started one of the area's first law practices.

After graduating from Villanova University, where his studies included naval architecture, Bill pursued graduate study in geography at Penn State. His study of Pennsylvania historic districts led to his employment with the Bureau for Historic Preservation, a division of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, where he oversaw a statewide historic resource survey in the early 1980s. An amateur photographer, he developed an extensive collection of his own photos of historic buildings, diners, and small town scenes from Pennsylvania's past.

Bill later pursued a law degree at the Franklin Pierce Law Center in Concord, New Hampshire (now the University of New Hampshire School of Law) and joined his father's law practice in 1986. He took over the firm when his father died in 1993 and was still practicing at the time of his death.

Bill was competing in the Master's National Sunfish Championship races held in Jensen Beach, Florida, when he suffered a brain hemorrhage.

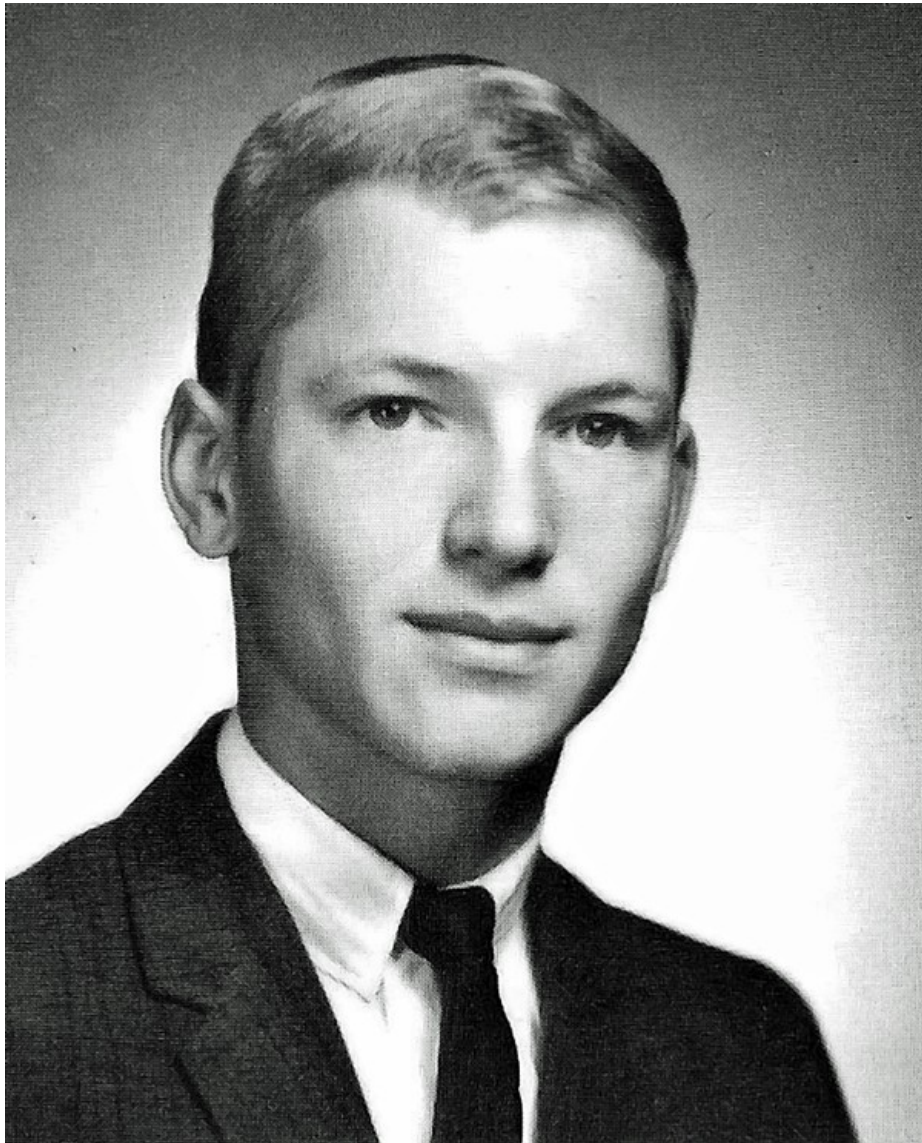
Bill resided in West Chester with his wife, June Roberts McLaughlin, and spent many happy times at their second home in Margate, NJ. He was an active member of the community, serving on the West Chester Historic and Architectural Review Board. He was also a current member and former chair of the West Chester Democratic Committee.

A competitive sailor from childhood, Bill was a member of the Marsh Creek Sailing Club. His cousin, Joseph McLaughlin of Philadelphia, remembers a Middlebury College classmate telling him in the fall of 1962 that, "Your cousin, Bill, wiped out the competition in sailing races all summer on the East Coast."

Bill is survived by his wife, June and numerous relatives. He will be missed by his extensive network of close friends, some of whom may have known him as "Mac." Bill will be remembered for his sense of humor, zest for life, personal kindness, and compassion for the less fortunate. He enjoyed the outdoors and walking his dog with June. 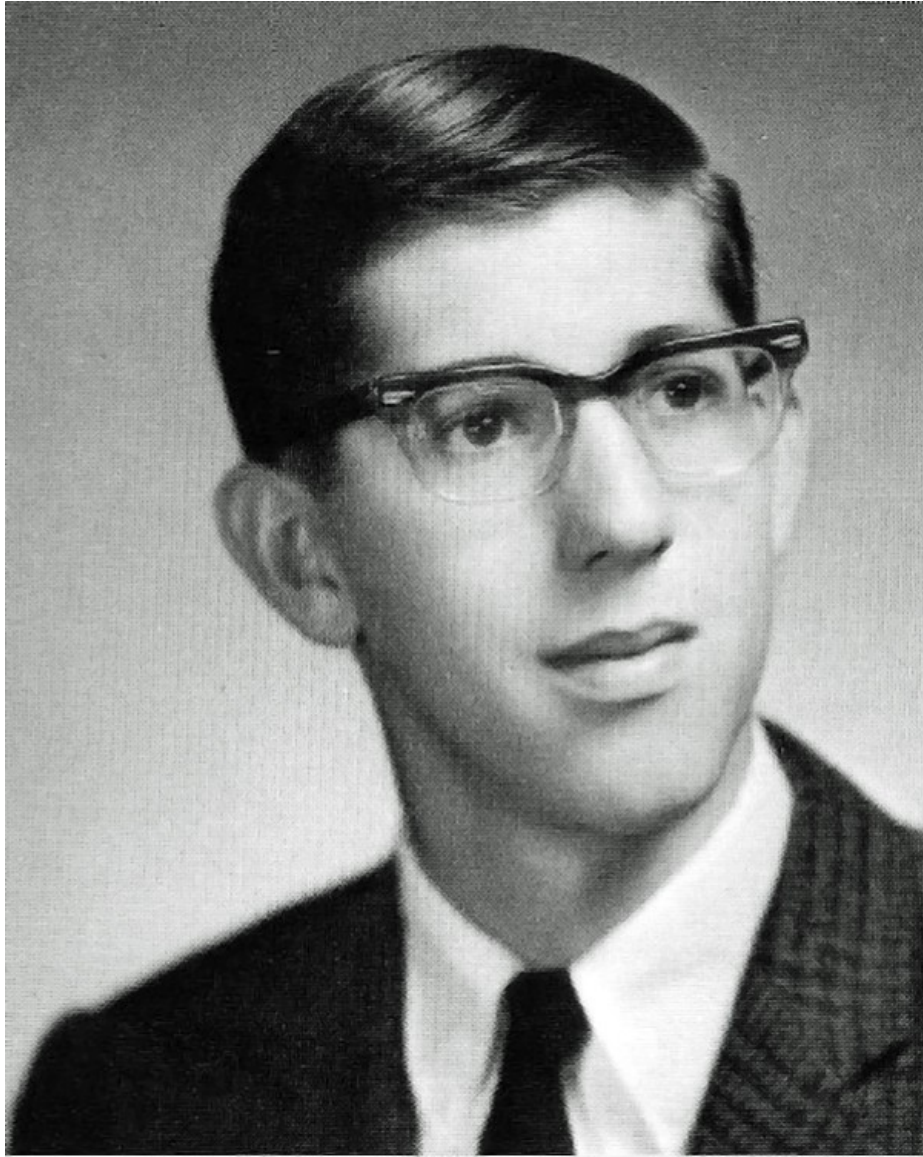

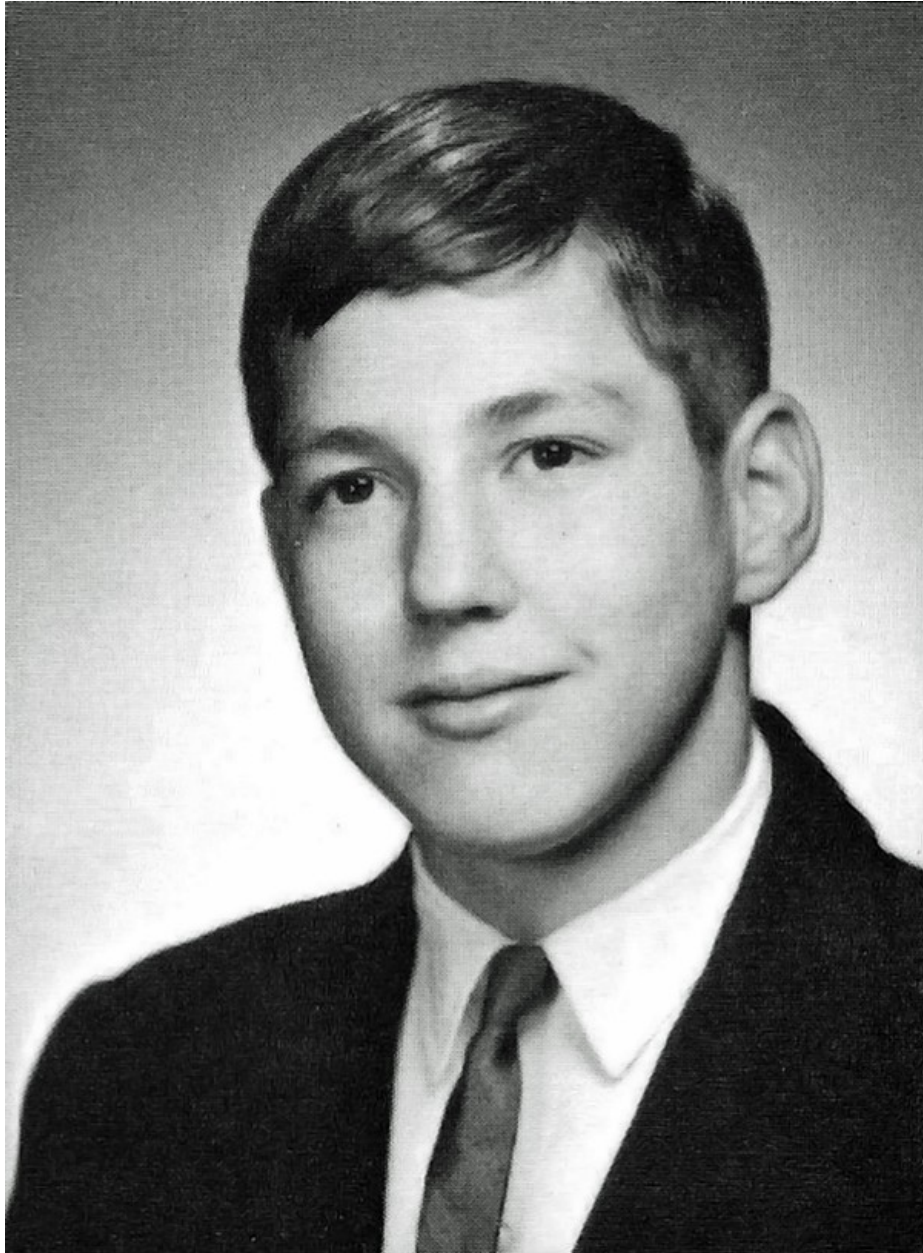

Peter Caverly Newlin of Chestertown, MD died on October 22, 2024, at the age of 77, in the care of Compass Regional Hospice House of Centreville, MD. He was born on February 26, 1947, in Bryn Mawr, PA to John Shipley and Virginia Strong Newlin. Peter grew up on a working farm in rural Pennsylvania where he learned the value of hard work.

He graduated from Great Valley High School in Malvern, PA. Before college, Peter served in the U.S. Army for four years, where he was stationed in Germany as a translator. After his military service, Peter graduated from Connecticut College with a bachelor's degree in history and literature. He then took a break from academia and worked as a welder in his father's machinist business. His carpentry skills led him to a mentor, Michael Borne, who was a historian with Maryland's Historic Trust. Peter honed his carpentry skills under Michael's tutelage in the art of historic restoration. He then enrolled at the University of Virginia. After one semester, he switched his major from architectural history to architecture, in which he received a master's degree.

His love for historic architecture drew him to Annapolis where he researched historic buildings. The buildings he most admired were restored by an architect named Jim Burch, FAIA. Peter joined Jim's firm, which became Burch & Associates in 1978. Peter went on to establish the Chestertown branch in 1978. The firm's most noteworthy projects from that time period were the renovation of Chestertown's Fire House into the Town Hall and the passive-solar Galena Bank, which won an award for energy conservation.

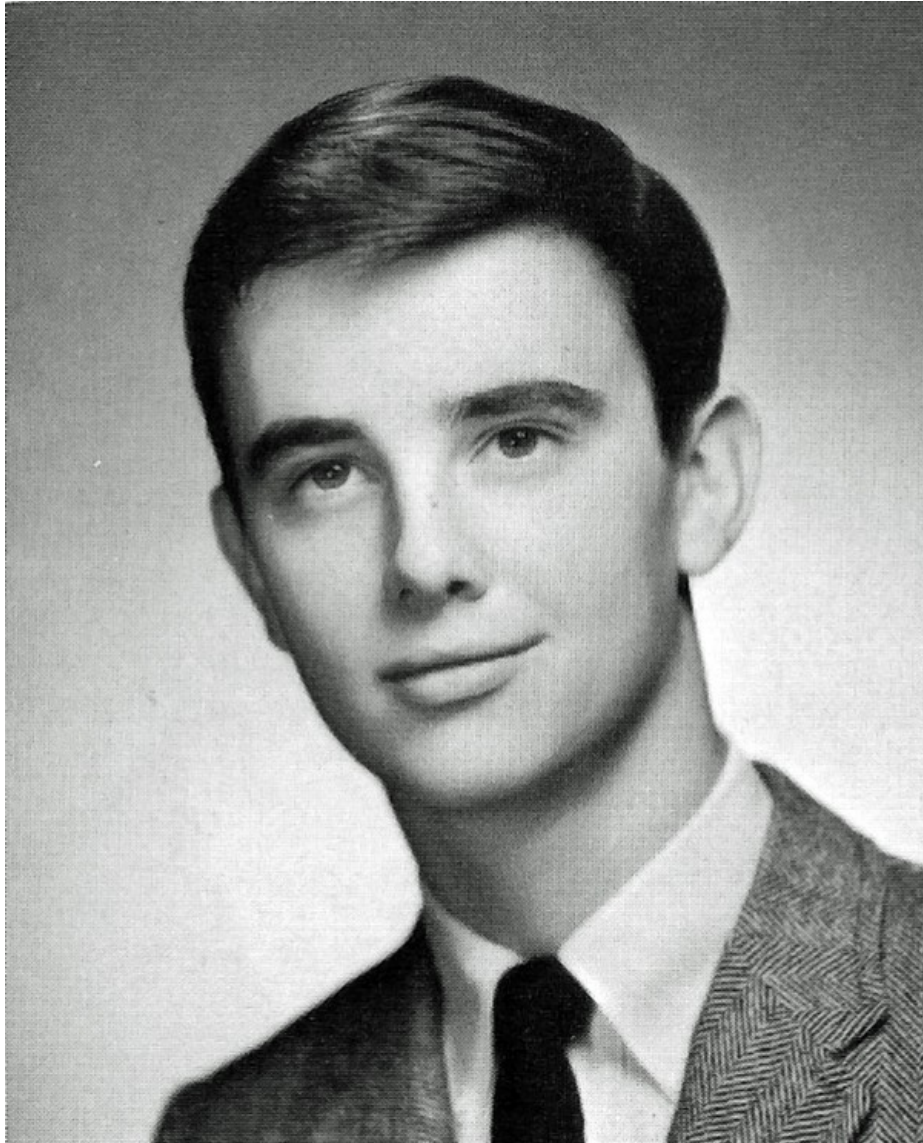
Peter purchased an office building in 1982 on Church Alley and established Chesapeake Architects, which became well known for specializing in waterfront architecture and historically sensitive design. In 1996, Peter became the first architect on the Eastern Shore to attain FAIA (Fellow of the American Institute of Architects) status. Throughout his distinguished career, Peter was recognized for his design talents from local, state, and international entities, including Progressive Architecture magazine for a rural town planning project, the Maryland Historical Trust for preservation projects, Delmarva Power for energy conscious design, and numerous "Excellence in Architecture" awards from chapters of the American Institute of Architects. Some of Peter's projects included Washington College's Lelia Hynson Pavilion, on the Chester River, and the historic restoration of the Garfield Theater on High Street.

His hobbies included sailing and racing boats, racquetball, handball, history, reading, and hiking. He also loved animals, especially cats. He is survived by his wife, Gale Tucker, stepdaughter, Julia Ramsey, his brothers J. Shipley Newlin, Jr. (Helen), Claiborne Newlin (Debbie, predeceased), Alf Newlin (Lotte), and his sister, Nina Newlin.

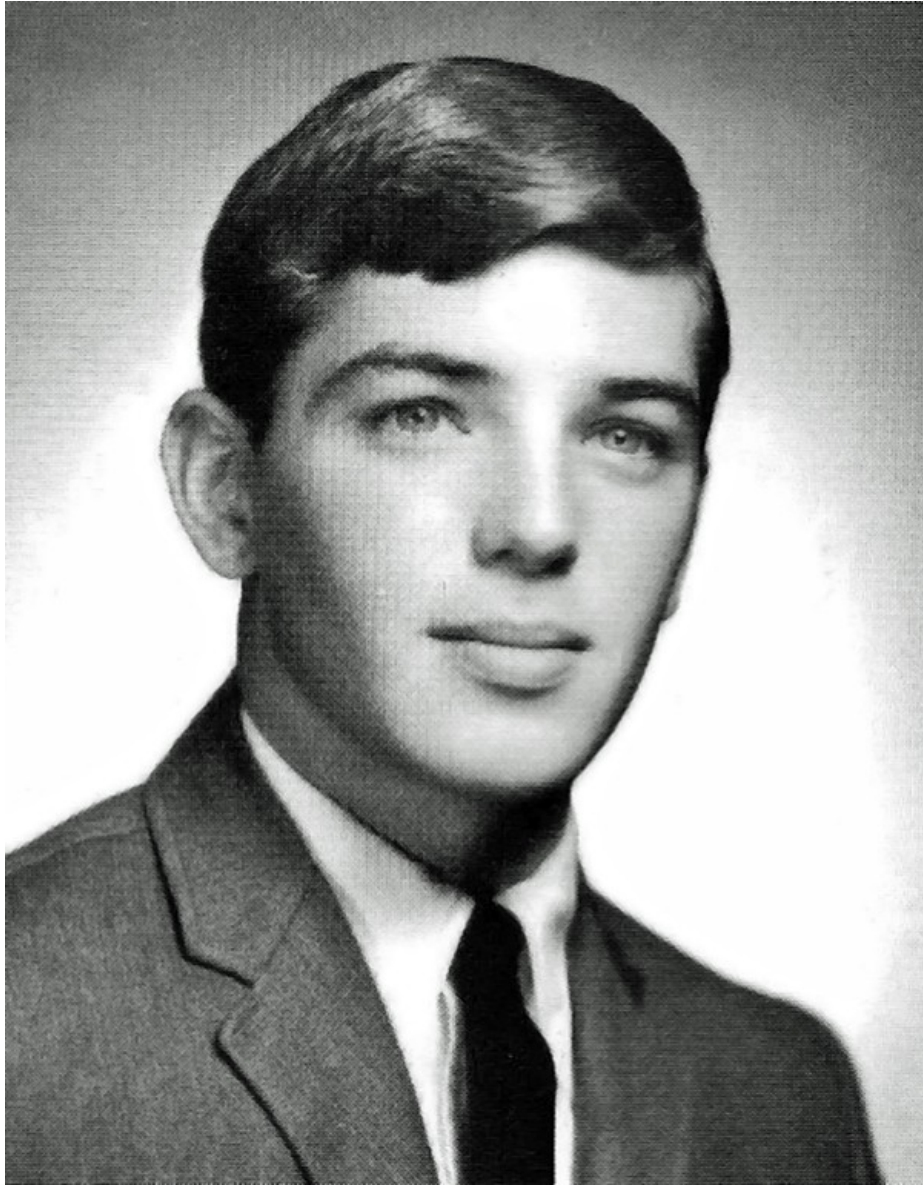

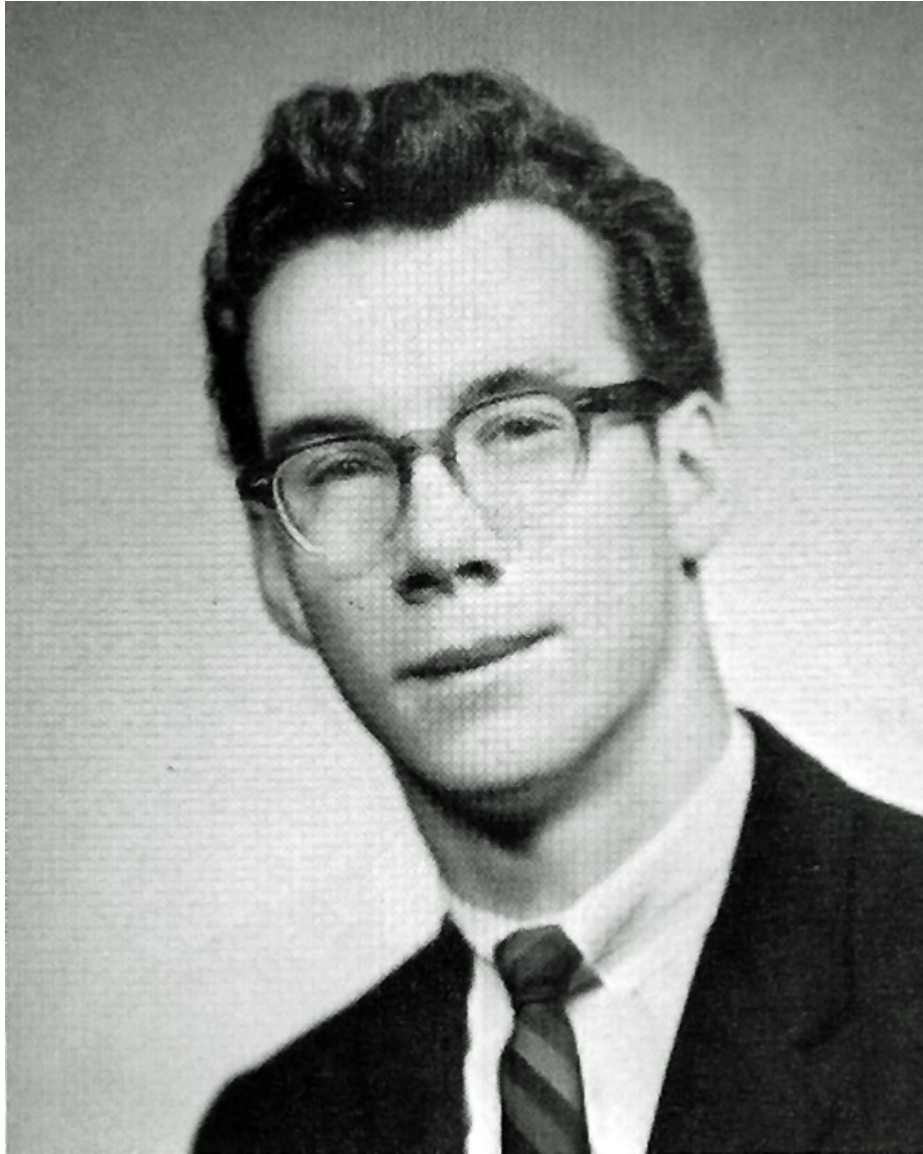

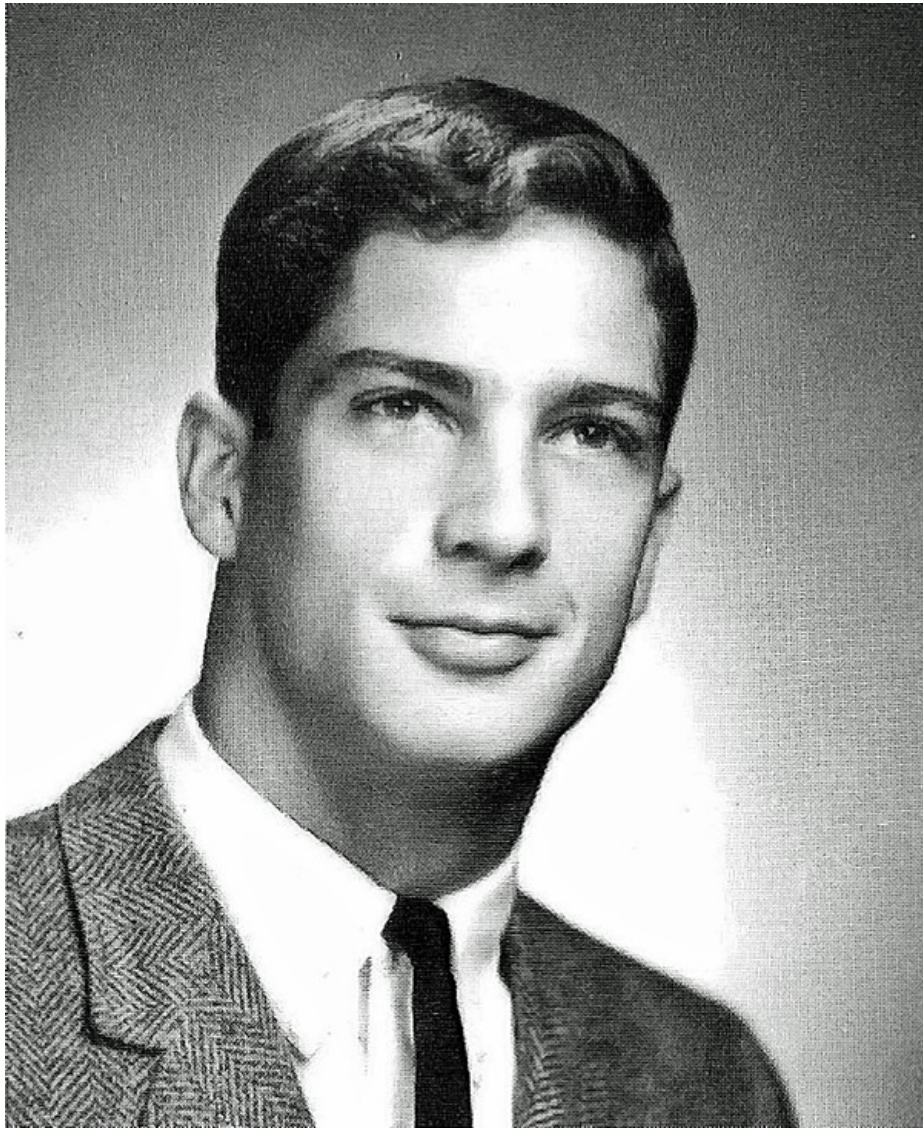

#### Final Mission of PFC Robert J. Nixon

On November 23, 1968, C Company, 4th Battalion, 9th Infantry, had a major engagement with the Viet Cong in the Boi Loi Woods, three miles southwest of Truong Mit in Tay Ninh Province, RVN. At 0915 hours, during a sweep of the area, the company came under heavy fire from a hedgerow. Artillery fire and armed helicopters were called in to soften the enemy position, but when the company attempted to assault after the supporting fires were lifted, it was again struck by a withering enemy fire. The fight continued all day before the enemy broke contact. Company losses throughout the day were 15 killed and 20 wounded. A search of the enemy position after he withdrew found six enemy bodies, one RPG-7 rocket launcher, seven AK-47 rifles, five rounds of RPG-7 ammunition, five pounds of enemy documents, five pounds of medical supplies, two hand grenades, and 11 pounds of explosives. A Vietnamese Regional Force Company that moved into the area to support the contact located a significant enemy cache at a location one kilometer east of the contact. Americans lost in the battle included SP4 David I. Briggs, PFC James C. Carlson, PFC John W. Colbert, SP4 Arnold R. Diekema, 1LT Michael N. Loitz, SGT Richard A. Milks, PFC Robert J. Nixon, PFC Frank Sanfilippo, SP4 Richard C. Stevens, PFC Joseph D. Szidor, PFC Mitchel R. Tyler, PFC Terrel J. Vidrine, and CPT Carl J. Winter.
